## <u>Criteria Guidance for the Northamptonshire</u> <u>Youth Opportunity Fund (Money 4 Youth Scheme)</u> and Youth Capital Fund

#### The Youth Opportunity Fund should:

- Give a voice to and influence young people, particularly disadvantaged young people, about things to do and places to go, and to give a powerful message to young people that they are important;
- Improve things to do and places to go in line with what young people want in their neighbourhood;
- Provide opportunities for young people to develop their confidence, knowledge, skills and abilities and gain recognition and/or accreditation for them;
- Increase the well-being of young people by contributing to the achievement of the Every Child Matters (ECM) outcomes, which are:
  - Achieve economic well being
  - Make a positive contribution
  - Be healthy
  - Stay safe
  - Enjoy and achieve
- Increase young people's involvement with services and decision making at local level.
- There are no restrictions on the range of initiatives and activities that the YOF can support, provided that they are supporting the outcomes from Every Child Matters.
- Young people should be encouraged to consider local needs and circumstances as a part
  of their role in shaping provision for young people beyond their immediate group, including
  with other young people from different cultural and social backgrounds.
- All young people aged 13-19 should be able to participate in this initiative in a meaningful way if they wish, especially young people from disadvantaged and hard-to-reach groups.
- YOF/YCF should be accessible to as many young people as possible, ages 13-19, including those from disadvantaged or hard-to-reach groups (as both recipients and decision makers) and support projects which provide open access to young people as well as those designed to meet the needs of specific groups of young people for whom targeted provision is necessary. Disadvantaged/hard-to-reach groups might include the following groups which may experience barriers to participation:
  - Looked after Young people
  - Young Travellers
  - Disabled young people and young people with mental health issues
  - Lesbian, gay and bi-sexual young people
  - Young people at risk of involvement in crime
  - Young parents
  - Young people who are rurally isolated
  - Young carers (or relatives who are disabled, have an illness, mental health issues or are misusing alcohol or substances)
  - Black and minority ethnic young people
  - Young victims of domestic violence

This is not an exhaustive list and you may be able to think of others and remember your project can be targeted at a specific group of young people or it can just be aimed at young people in the 13-19 age group, although you would have to show how you were going to make the project inclusive of disadvantaged/hard-to-reach groups.

#### **Money 4 Youth Scheme - The Youth Opportunity Fund**

#### What is it?

A fund given to the County Council to provide young people aged 13-19 with a budget to plan and provide activities for young people in their own neighbourhood.

#### **How Much?**

The Government has awarded the county's young people £702,000.

#### Why?

We want young people to be involved in decision making and we want young people to receive the 'right opportunities and activities' going on in your own neighbourhood, that you choose yourselves.

#### Who chooses the ideas?

You choose the ideas by sending in a simple form to your local Youth Forum (contact emails and phone numbers supplied below). Young people from your local district (or borough) youth forum choose the best, most interesting ideas, which can be delivered to you quickly with the help of council staff.

#### How do I apply?

You will need to get hold of a grant application form that has been designed by young people, and the guidance notes written by young people, and then send the form in to the contact person in your district (names and contact details below):

The local youth forum members look at all the ideas and then choose the ones that will make the best impact for all young people in the neighbourhood. They will choose the best ideas and then the council officers will sort out the arrangements to start the project. Everyone who applies will be told about the best projects and be thanked for sending in their ideas whether their idea was chosen or not.

#### Important issues

We want you to think about whether your project gets lots of other young people involved, active and taking part. We want you to make sure that young people who don't always get activities or opportunities are catered for and supported so that they can take part in activities.
