- **Reason for Hearing** – to be outlined by the **Licensing Officer** or the **Chair**.
- **Format of the hearing** – an explanation of the format of the proceedings:
  1. **Applicant** (or his/her representative) will address the sub-committee first and put their case.
  2. **The Chair** leads an examination of the **Applicant's case**. First, the panel may ask questions and then the Chair invites Responsible and Interested Parties to participate. Questions may only relate to the points made by the applicant.
  3. **The Representors** (and responsible and Interested Parties) then state their case.
  4. **The Chair** leads an examination of the **Representor's case**.

Each party will be given an equal maximum period of time in which to present their case and may, if given permission by the Chair, question any other party.

- **Summing Up**
  - By the Representors
  - By the Applicant
- **Sub-committee retires** – and may call for the Solicitor for advice if required.
- **Sub-Committee deliver their decision and reasons for their decision at the conclusion of the meeting IF:**
  1. Application for conversion of existing licence
  2. Application for conversion of existing club certificate
  3. Application by holder of justices' licence for grant of personal licence
  4. Application for conversion and variation of premises licence (including variation of DPS)
  5. Application for conversion and variation of club premises certificate
  6. Counter notice following police objection to temporary event notice
  7. Review of Premises Licence following Closure Order

In all other cases, the Sub-committee delivers its decision and reasons for its decision within five working days beginning with the day on which the hearing was held.

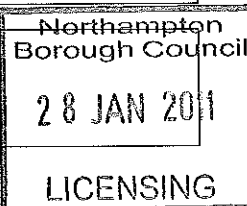

I act on behalf of the Chief Officer for Northamptonshire Police, Mr Lee. I call for a Review of the Club Premises Certificate for Far Cotton WMC under the Licensing Objective of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

On the 12<sup>th</sup> of January 2011 Northamptonshire Police received a Temporary Event Notice (T.E.N.) from the Secretary of the Far Cotton WMC, Mrs Paula Gale. The event applied for was an amateur boxing club presentation, to be held on the 21<sup>st</sup> of January 2011 between the hours of 06:00pm and midnight.

The application was not made in time as a T.E.N. needs to be applied for 10 clear working days before the proposed event is held, this is a mandatory part of the Licensing Act 2003.

Checks conducted with Northampton Borough Council Licesning Department revealed that they also received the T.E.N. on the same date the 12<sup>th</sup> of January 2011. NBC Licensing also confirmed that a Counter Notice had been issued by them to the applicant refusing the T.E.N. (Please see attached document).

On the 17<sup>th</sup> of January 2011 Northamptonshire Police wrote to the applicant detailing that it would be an offence under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry on with the proposed event without the authority of the T.E.N. (Please see attached document).

PC 113 Bryan also contacted the applicant on the mobile phone number listed on the application and left a voicemail stating that the event would be unlicensed. The voicemail message detailed that is was the voicemail for Paula Gale, the applicant.

On Friday the 21<sup>st</sup> of January 2011 Northamptonshire Police received information

that Far Cotton WMC were still going ahead with the event regardless that it was unlicensed. I contacted the Club by phone and spoke with the Club President Mr Pickering. He confirmed that the event was still going ahead and he was aware of the fact that it was unlicensed. I informed Mr Pickering that Police Officers would visit that evening to ascertain the Clubs position.

PS 1056 Worthington also contacted the applicant Paula Gale on the mobile number detailed on the T.E.N. application and left a message on the voicemail detailing that the event is unlicensed and that she would leave herself open to prosecution if the event went ahead.

The Club was visited in the evening and the boxing event was being carried on (Please see attached report from Inspector Docherty).

I would ask the Licensing Committee to take into consideration that all efforts had been made to inform the Club and the applicant that the event was unlicensed and that the Club and the applicant were aware of this however still proceeded with the event.





Dear Mrs Gale,

I find myself in the unfortunate position of writing to you about you proposed event for the 21st of January 2011. Northamptonshire Police have adopted a new policy whereby when we are notified that a T.E.N has been refused, that we will make contact with the applicant and advise them that to go ahead with the event would be an offence covered by the Licensing Act 2003, (Section 136 Unauthorised Licensable Activity).

Unfortunately if the T.E.N. is not submitted within 10 working days then the Local Authority have no discretion and have to refuse the application, this is a mandatory part of the legislation in relation to the 10 working days.

The Police in turn are duty bound to advise the applicant of the consequences of continuing with the event. I do not find these letters easy to compile since the proposed event would not cause Northamptonshire Police an issue if the 10 working days were complied with, I would ask that you consider another date for the event.

Refused T.E.N.'s are circulated to local Police Officers so that compliance checks can be made and the Club will be visited on the 21st January 2011.

**Report From Inspector X0049 Docherty (MSc).**

**Subject: Far Cotton Working Men's Club, Northampton.**

I report as follows:-

As a result of information received from Northampton Council Licensing Department, in relation to the running of a live sporting event within the club, I and uniformed officers from Campbell Square Police Station visited the said premises.

At 1955hrs on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> January 2011, Sgt1347 Kennedy, PC0162 Prosser, PC0622 Stevens and I entered the premises, with a head cam recording facility to record our findings and speak with the organisers / managers of the proposed sporting event. Once within the club, I identified myself to a Mr Ralph Pickering the Clubs President. Mr Pickering invited me and the accompanying officers up stairs into his private office.

On entering the office I outlined to Mr Pickering the nature and reason for my licensing visit.

I explained that Northamptonshire Police licensing officers had been informed that the Far Cotton Club intended to run a live boxing sporting event within the club grounds, without a Temporary Events Notice under the licensing act.

Mr Pickering appeared embarrassed and accepted that this was the current status for the club.

He went on to explain that he and Paula Gail the clubs Secretary had in fact made an application to the Northampton Council on the 4<sup>th</sup> of January 2011.

I then formally asked Mr Pickering do you have a current licence for this event. He replied "No"

I then asked Mr Pickering "Are you prepared to go ahead with this event without a licence".

He replied "Yes"

I then advised Mr Pickering "If you go ahead with this live sporting event without a licence, you will be committing an offence for which Northampton Council Licensing Committee will find you guilty of breaching the required licensing requirement.

He replied "I am prepared to go ahead with the event outside of the advice given".

I noted Mr Pickering's comments and reread the above to him for clarity.

He again stated "I am prepared to go ahead with the event outside of the advice given".

I and the officers were allowed access to the sporting event which was recorded by PC 622 Stevens with the aid of a head cam as live evidence of the event. PC 622

Stevens has now recorded this footage to disk and booked it into detained property at Campbell Square Police Station reference; WN/001090/11.

Mr Pickering also alluded to the fact that the event was a charity sporting event for which there was capacity for 180 attendees and the fact that admission to the said event was on a fee basis of £8:50 per head for Adults.

At 2010hrs the same day having gathered the relevant evidence I again advised Mr Pickering to reconsider his plan to go ahead with the live sporting event.

Again Mr Pickering stated that he was prepared to go ahead with the event and deal with any licence transgression via the Licensing Committee at a later date.

I now submit this report with attached evidence of my licensing visit, for the urgent attention of the licensing committee to review.



**Impending Premises Certificate Review (CP0012)**

As a club with great respect for the law, we find ourselves having to admit from the evidence supplied by the police, that we did act outside the terms of the Licensing Act 2003 when we held a charity boxing tournament at the club on 21<sup>st</sup> January 2011.

It would be greatly appreciated if our statement of mitigation could be considered by the Committee when carrying out the review.

The Committee will be aware that the stringent safety requirements of this activity required the bringing together of a range of professionals to ensure the wellbeing of contestants and supporters alike involving substantial costs.

The Police and Borough Council would have been aware when they received the TENS on 12<sup>th</sup> January 2011 that it was to be rejected on the grounds of insufficient notice having been given. Had a phone call been made on that day to the number provided on the application form there would have been more than sufficient time to cancel the event.

However, it was not until 17<sup>th</sup> January that the police wrote informing the club of the rejection and that letter was not received until the 20<sup>th</sup> January. Apparently a phone message was left on Mrs Gale's phone on 17<sup>th</sup> January that was not picked up. The shortness of this notice created a logistical nightmare in trying to cancel the event.

On the evening of 20<sup>th</sup> January Councillors Brendan Glynane and Kevin Reeves attended the club concerning this matter. Mr Reeves advised Mr Dawes (Club Trustee) not to worry too much as he was on the Licensing Committee. Later Mr Glynane and Mr Reeves told Mr Pickering (Club President) that it would be sorted in the morning. Those words of reassurance left the organisers and club executive with the very real impression that the event would be allowed to go ahead.


In the event, the Councillors assurances came to nought, but by then it was impossible to cancel.

The statement from Inspector X0049 Doherty (MSc) omitted to state that he said he could come back mob-handed and close the event down but he would not do that as it would cause a near riot. The club management felt that if the Police closing the event would cause a near riot, the club

management closing the event would cause mayhem. On those grounds Mr Pickering very reluctantly felt unable to comply with the law in this instance.

In the end the event was well attended and well ordered and raised £1,800 for the boxing club which is to help the kids relieve their aggression in a controlled manner. The Club is devising a policy with the help of the police and its own Branch Executive to ensure that such an occurrence as this can never be repeated.

In considering your response to this admitted offence, we hope the committee will take into account the fact that what was done, was done reluctantly. As with many clubs we are in a daily struggle for survival and would beg the Committee to bear this in mind together with our previously unblemished record of compliance that has always been, and will continue to be, our policy.

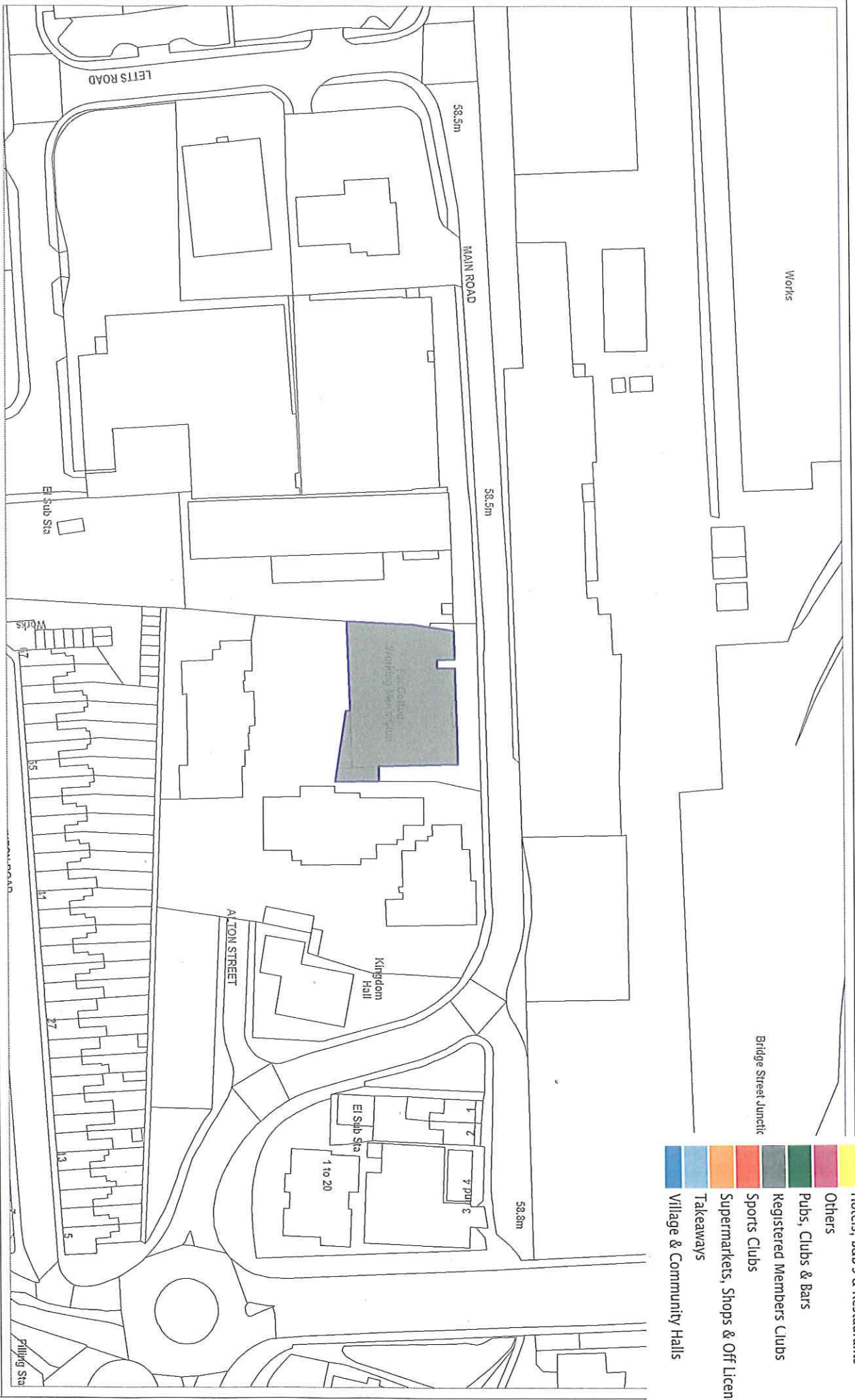
