1. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION

Everyone introduced themselves, including the Co-Chairs of the Forum Anna King and Barry Hansford.

Joe Biskupski from Northampton Borough Council was in attendance, and prepared the notes of this meeting.

2. APOLOGIES

Apologies were received from Stephen Bennett (Northampton Pride)

3. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING AND MATTERS ARISING

The minutes of the previous meeting of the LGBTQ Forum held on 29 January 2013 were agreed as correct.

The Forum also had sight of the minutes of the NBC Forums Budget Consultation Meeting of 22 January 2013.

Barry Hansford said that he liked the question/answer format of the Forum's minutes. This showed that the LGBTQ Forum was active in posing questions to organisations such as the Borough Council.

4. NORTHAMPTON PRIDE

Matthew Toresen reported that he met with Stephen Bennett a few weeks ago. Steven said he said that it would be better to organise a smaller event outside All Saints Church. Discussion also focused on the governance of the Pride group. Matthew advised him that there were benefits from becoming an incorporated group

5. PLANNING THE WORK OF LGBTQ FORUM FOR 2013

The Forum agreed that there should be a focus on the following areas in 2013: hate crime, housing & welfare, education and events.

Volunteers from the Forum / other LGBTQ organisation in Northampton are needed to lead on these topics. These issues should be discussed within LGBTQ organisations.

A discussion took place about topics that should be covered in more detail over the year. The flipchart notes of the discussion are contained in an annex to these minutes.

Hate Crimes

- Existence of LAGLOs in some police forces;
- Not all organisations are known to Hate Crime Units in all police forces.

Question: If someone is attacked, who decides whether it is a hate crime?

Answer: If someone (witness or is a victim) considers it a hate crime or the police officer considers it a hate crime.

Question: What is a hate crime?

Answer: It is about perception. It should cover one of the five characteristics of hate crime.

- The Hate Crimes Unit would be happy to have their e-mail addresses sent out.
- Matthew Toresen said that a point of contact is needed, with trained officers who understand the issues facing LGBTQ people. A “portal” for LGBTQ people.
- Barry Hansford said that he is interested to see where LAGLOs are more effective. In an ideal world we should have all police officers familiar with LGBTQ issues.

Data

- Lots of data, sometimes it is difficult to make sense of the volume.

Question: what are the biggest hate crime issues?

Answer: racism is the most significant issue in terms of the statistics.

- Reporting of homophobic incidents is consistent
- Figures are meaningless without knowing the proportion of people who are gay, disabled etc.
- It is difficult to get data on faith and sexual orientation.
- Can data be sent out electronically to members of the Forum for further consideration?

Question: Does the Police or the Council map statistics?

Answer: Will Finn at the Borough Council is interested in this work. Sometimes the Police are asked by the Borough Council to map the figures

- The Police are doing some work on police engaging with deaf people, and would like to speak with Lee about this.
- Will Finn said that there is a gap in equalities and diversity training at NBC. Currently, he is working with the council’s human resources team to develop training on diversity and hate crimes.
- Barry Hansford said that he thinks it would be useful for Will to speak with other Forums about this.

Education

- The Hate Crime Unit works with Jo Wood at NCC. The County Council has had difficulty in encouraging some schools to report hate crime.
- Among some young people, there is a problem with the use of 'gay'. It is sometimes used in a negative context.
- Need to work with schools to challenge stereotypes and behaviour.

6. COMMUNITY INFORMATION EXCHANGE

Lee: Waiting for Community Foundation decision on funding for an LGBT group for blind people.

Matthew said that it was important to provide evidence of need when applying for funding. Matthew added that he is happy to work with Lee to help his group produce a DVD.

Lee said that this group meets every two months and is looking for money to develop this.

Lesbian Line: the weekly Wednesday meetings at Women's Aid Building continue. They are hoping to do something at Christmas and are building up funds to pay rent.

Matthew: FAN have been nominated for National Diversity Award. In order to be shortlisted, they need the community to nominate them.

A Bookfest event is planned for 14 to 16 September 2014. It is planned that this will become an independent group.

Barry: The Northampton College LGBTQ group is steadily developing. Students have been requested the "Some people are gay – get over it" sticker.

Barry thanked Northampton College for putting on the recent LGBTQ event.

- Themed meetings: Education could be covered in the July 2013 meeting
