Bookfest took place last weekend and was launched on Friday by Rose Collis, singer, author, artist etc. Numbers were disappointing on Saturday and Sunday but the authors enjoyed the event.

LGBTQ Forum Logo Competition - Two entries have been received which is disappointing. SB will distribute flyers to encourage more entries but the closing date cannot be changed. It will now be opened up and the design brief re-circulated. He will also visit the college. Judging needs to be anonymous and the brief is to include the NBC logo, reflect LGBTQ and include something to do with Northampton.

Hate Crime

Rob Smith sent apologies but had reported that he had attended a forum in August which highlighted an increase in Islamaphobia. It also highlighted a lot of attacks against Somalis but they don't report all incidents as there is a lack of trust of the police. Training is being developed along with new information sharing processes.

The County Schools Challenge was held recently and Mrs Lancaster from the Sophie Lancaster foundation attended. The day addressed homophobic hate crime and was very well received.

She gave a brief overview of some of the difficulties experienced by deaf people and the barriers to accessing accessing services due to misinterpretation and levels of ability to read. Access to information on the internet is not in a suitable format and people experience issues in relation to health, and services. Joanne encouraged people to attend the training as this is an ever growing issue in society as a large percentage of the population have some sort of hearing problem. There are 15-20 places available.
