<b>Record of the expected decision to be made:</b>	To ask Cabinet to approve the transfer of a piece of land in Southbridge to the Housing Revenue Account, together with the development of the land for affordable rented housing, in accordance with a section 106 agreement relating to the granting of planning permission on an adjacent site.

<b>Record of the expected decision to be made:</b>	A request to consult with the public for the purpose of using the Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) to gate the public highway between Berkerley Close and Billing Road. The alleyway is pedestrian only and has been linked to a number of crimes in the residential area. Initial engagement with stakeholders and partners through the Crispin Multi Agency meeting has identified support for the proposed consultation.

<b>Record of the expected decision to be made:</b>	A request to consult with the public for the purpose of using the Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) to gate a number of public highways in Portland Place and Exeter place. The purpose being to create cul-de-sacs and channel pedestrians through the main routes in the estate to reduce residential and vehicular crime in the area and create safer and more secure residential and parking spaces for residents.

<b>Title of Expected Decision</b>	Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) for Parks & Open Spaces
<b>Record of the expected decision to be made:</b>	<p>The Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime &amp; Policing Act 2014 commenced on 20 October 2014. One of the powers available through this legislation is a Public Spaces Projection Order (PSPO) which is designed to stop individuals or groups committing anti-social behaviour in a public space.</p> <p>We seek to use this legislation to help deal with several types of anti-social behaviour (detailed in the report) in parks &amp; open spaces.</p> <p>The legislation requires public consultation before making such an Order.</p> <p>The statutory requirement is to consult with the chief officer of police and the local policing body for the area, whatever community representatives the local authority</p>

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	<p>thinks appropriate and any owner or occupier of land within the restricted area.</p> <p>A PSPO, once made, is valid for 3 years and, if still required, should be renewed before the expiry date.</p> <p>The purpose of the report is to ask Cabinet to approve the 12-week statutory consultation period.</p>
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
