I act on behalf of the Chief Officer of Police for Northamptonshire Mr Lee and I call for a Review of the Premises Licence for Booze 'n' Stuff, Northampton. The grounds for the Review are under the Licensing Objectives of The Prevention of Crime and Disorder and The Protection of Children from Harm. On the 22<sup>nd</sup> of June 2012 Northamptonshire Police conducted a Test Purchase operation at the premises and the two Test Purchasers were sold alcohol, one was 15 years old and the other 16 years old. Two bottles of Cider ABV 4% were sold the seller Mr Amin an employee was issued with a Penalty Notice for Disorder (£80.00) for the offence of Section 146 of the Licensing Act 2003 selling alcohol to a minor. On the 18<sup>th</sup> of August 2012 Northamptonshire Police conducted another Test Purchase operation at the premises and alcohol was sold to the two Test Purchase operatives, both were 16 years old. Two bottles of WKD Blue ABV 4% was sold. The seller Mr Abdullahi who was also the Premises Licence Holder was invited to Campbell Square Police Station at a later date to be formally P.A.C.E. interviewed about the sale. Mr Abdullahi on interview admitted the offence of section 146 of the Licenising Act 2003 selling alcohol to a minor and was Cautioned for the offence. In addition to this Mr Abdullahi accepted a section 169A Closure Notice for Persistently Selling Alcohol to Children rather than being reported for the offence of 147A of the Licensing Act 2003 and going to court. The Closure Notice was served on the 10<sup>th</sup> of October 2012 the time and dates of the closure were 12 noon on the 26<sup>th</sup> of October 2012 to 12 noon on the 9<sup>th</sup> of November 2012. Northamptonshire Police have waited until this time to submit the Review papers as Northamptonshire Police ran an operation to reduce alcohol fuelled violence over the December period and should the premises have come to our attention during this period Northamptonshire Police would have added any additional information to these Review papers, I can state there were no further matters to add.

Northamptonshire Police have concerns in relation to this premises as during the interview of Mr Abdullahi did not know the full name of his Designated Premises Supervisor and could only state that the Designated Premises Supervisor ran a business in Peterborough. He did state that the DPS did visit his store from time to time however this is hard to prove or disprove. Clearly the day to day running of the premises is done by Mr Abdullahi he was present at both of the underage sales and whenever I have visited the premises. Mr Abdullahi has very little knowledge of the Licensing Act 2003 and his responsibilities in relation to the act in my opinion. Northamptonshire are of the belief that to uphold the Licensing Objectives the following should be considered by the Licensing Sub Committee.

Mr Abdullahi should take a course for Personal Licence Holders and obtain a Personal Licence.

Mr Abdullahi should then vary the Premises Licence to make himself the Designated Premises Supervisor, as he is day to day control of the business.

Mr Abdullahi should also take a course in respect of being the Designated Premises Supervisor, the BII (British Institute of Innkeepers) have a National certificate in respect of this qualification, for clarity I am not promoting the BII there are other institutions that run this course I am just aware the BII do this course as I have sat this course myself.
