January 21 update: Recommendations were approved 17 December 2020:

West Northants Sustainable Food Place has been working in partnership to complete a food mapping provision within Northampton. This identified both the area's most in need and gaps within provision. West Northants Sustainable Food Place are working together to commit to action to improving the quality of food under six key headings. These are:

- Taking a strategic and collaborative approach to good food governance and action
- Building public awareness, active food citizenship and a local good food movement
- <u>Tackling food poverty, diet related ill-</u> <u>health and access to affordable healthy</u> <u>food</u>

- an Anti-Food Poverty Strategy, which must include all demographics, ensuring that it is an allinclusive Policy is investigated.
- That a Working Group, led by the Community and Engagement Team, is set up and tasked with identifying areas where holiday hunger is a concern and to seek solutions to increasing food provision for children 365 days a year. In addition, the outcomes that have come out following the Marcus Ashford Scheme within Northampton are continued and built upon to ensure food provision is developed for all children 365 days a year.

NPH and DWP are promoting Healthy Start vouchers through their Newsletters and communications due out April 2021.

Over 2 million pounds available to support families in Northamptonshire through the Winter Grant Scheme, CENCAB, CLS, VIN, NPH and NBC all direct referrers to the scheme - which is being administered by NCC. Access to support in the form of a voucher for food and utilities.

DEFRA grant - £300,000 also available for food banks and providers in West Northants. More than 50% of the funding has been allocated to organisations through 2 tranches of funding applicants. Another tranche available at the end of January/beginning of February.
