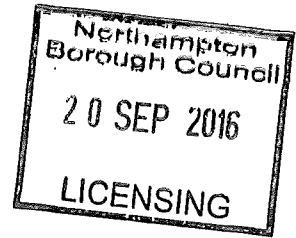

- **Declarations of Interest by Councillors**
- **Reason for Hearing** – to be outlined by the **Licensing Officer** or the **Chair**.
- **Format of the hearing** – an explanation of the format of the proceedings:
 1. **Applicant** (or his/her representative) will address the sub-committee first and put their case.
 2. **The Chair** leads an examination of the **Applicant's case**. First, the panel may ask questions and then the Chair invites Responsible and Interested Parties to participate. Questions may only relate to the points made by the applicant.
 3. **The Representors** (and responsible and Interested Parties) then state their case.
 4. **The Chair** leads an examination of the **Representor's case**.

Each party will be given an equal maximum period of time in which to present their case and may, if given permission by the Chair, question any other party.

- The licence holder shall operate and maintain a refusals register in respect of declined sales of alcohol where the attempted purchaser was suspected of being under 18 years of age or drunk.
- The refusals register shall be kept on the premises and be made available immediately upon request to an authorised officer of the Police or Local Authority.
- The licence holder will ensure that within six weeks of any appointment of a member of staff, they receive adequate training to Responsible Alcohol Retailing standards or equivalent. A training record will be kept at the premises, which will be made available immediately upon request to an authorised officer of the Police or Local Authority.
- Staff records with regards to licensing accreditations and training shall be kept on the premises and produced to the Police and Authorised Local Authority Licensing Officers on demand.

- CCTV WILL be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of EVIDENTIAL QUALITY in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition. Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises and all areas where the sale/ supply of alcohol occurs. Equipment MUST be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings MUST be kept in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a period of 28 days and handed to Police on demand.

The Premises Licence Holder must ensure that at all times the DPS and all appointed members of staff are capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format EITHER DISC or VHS to the Police/Local Authority on demand.

The Recording equipment and tapes/discs shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual.

As a Responsible Authority under the 2003 Licensing Act, Northamptonshire County Council's Public Health Team makes the following representations in relation to the above licence application.

These representations relate to the following licensing objectives:

- The protection of children from harm
- The prevention of crime and disorder

Our approach

Northamptonshire County Council has begun screening licensing applications against a series of indicators relating to alcohol harm.

In order to identify geographical areas in the county which experience significant alcohol harm, the Public Health team has identified a number of indicators of alcohol harm and incorporated them into a tool which enables us to compare small geographical areas (Lower Layer Super Output Areas – LSOAs) with other geographical areas with a similar sized population across the county and rank them accordingly. The County is made up of 422 such LSOAs while Northampton borough is made up of 133 LSOAs.

The indicators used include data in relation to:

- Alcohol liaison nurse service data
- Presentations to Accident & Emergency (A&E) departments with a recorded link to alcohol
- Violent crimes reported to the police involving alcohol or with an identified link to a licensed premises
- Children's social care data with alcohol misuse identified in relation to an adult in the household
- Alcohol / substance misuse treatment client data, where alcohol misuse is identified
- Extent of existing licensed premises in the location of the area

(More information about the data used is included in the attached appendix)

Alcohol harm – LSOA Northampton 023D (E01027228)

The premises to which this licence application relates is contained within the LSOA referred to as Northampton 023D.

Based on our rankings of alcohol harm, this LSOA is ranked **number 7 of 133 LSOAs in Northampton Borough** and **number 9 of 422 LSOAs in the county** (where 1 indicates the highest levels of alcohol harm).

Specifically:

The number of Violent Crimes recorded by the police (rate per 1000 people) involving alcohol is the **6th highest of any LSOA in Northampton Borough** and **12th highest of any LSOA in the county**.

The number of clients (rate per 1,000 people) receiving treatment within public health commissioned treatment services and with alcohol as their primary problem substance is the **13th highest of any LSOA in Northampton Borough** and **21st highest of any LSOA in the county**.

The number of existing premises licensed to sell alcohol off the premises (rate per 1,000 people) in the LSOA is the **7th highest of any LSOA in Northampton Borough** and the **13th highest of any LSOA in the county**.

In addition, **the LSOA the premises is located in is bordered by 3 other LSOAs that are ranked in the top 10% for alcohol related harm** in Northampton.

Further details on these figures are contained in appendix 1.

Alcohol availability and alcohol harm:

There is extensive research which highlights a direct link between the availability of alcohol and alcohol related harm in the surrounding environment, including alcohol related disease and violence (Richardson 2014, NICE 2010, NICE 2014)*

The available research suggests that the density and prevalence of alcohol retail outlets influences alcohol related harm in a variety of ways, including:

- Creating greater physical availability of alcohol in a local area
- Increasing the visibility of alcohol advertising in a local area
- Shaping and reinforcing local attitudes and norms around drinking behaviour and drunkenness.

The ready availability of alcohol and its high profile marketing can contribute to a 'drinking culture' which in turn can lead to higher alcohol consumption levels and higher levels of alcohol related harm. In light of this and the above data, Northamptonshire County Council's Public Health Team on behalf of The Director of Public Health would like to see the following conditions added to the licence:

1. No Beer, Lager or Cider over 6.5% ABV to be sold.

2. The licensee will be required to display at all times, and in close proximity to all alcohol displays within the premises, the Alcohol Guidelines produced by the UK Chief Medical Officers, and any subsequent guidelines that replace them. The nature of the display material should be approved by the Director of Public Health / Public Health team.
3. There will be no window display posters or similar advertising containing any reference to alcohol on the premises shop frontage or the highway abutting the premises.

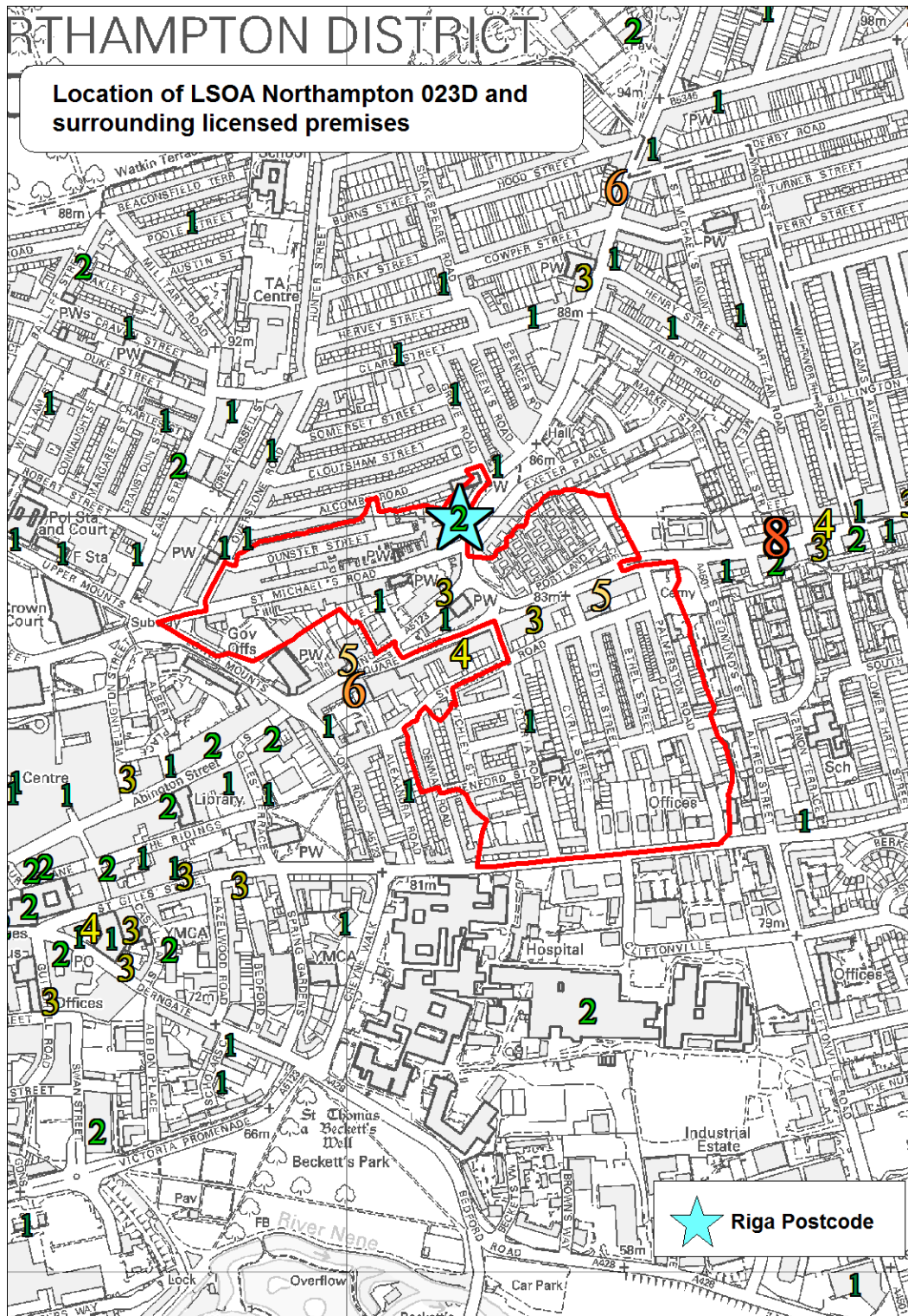

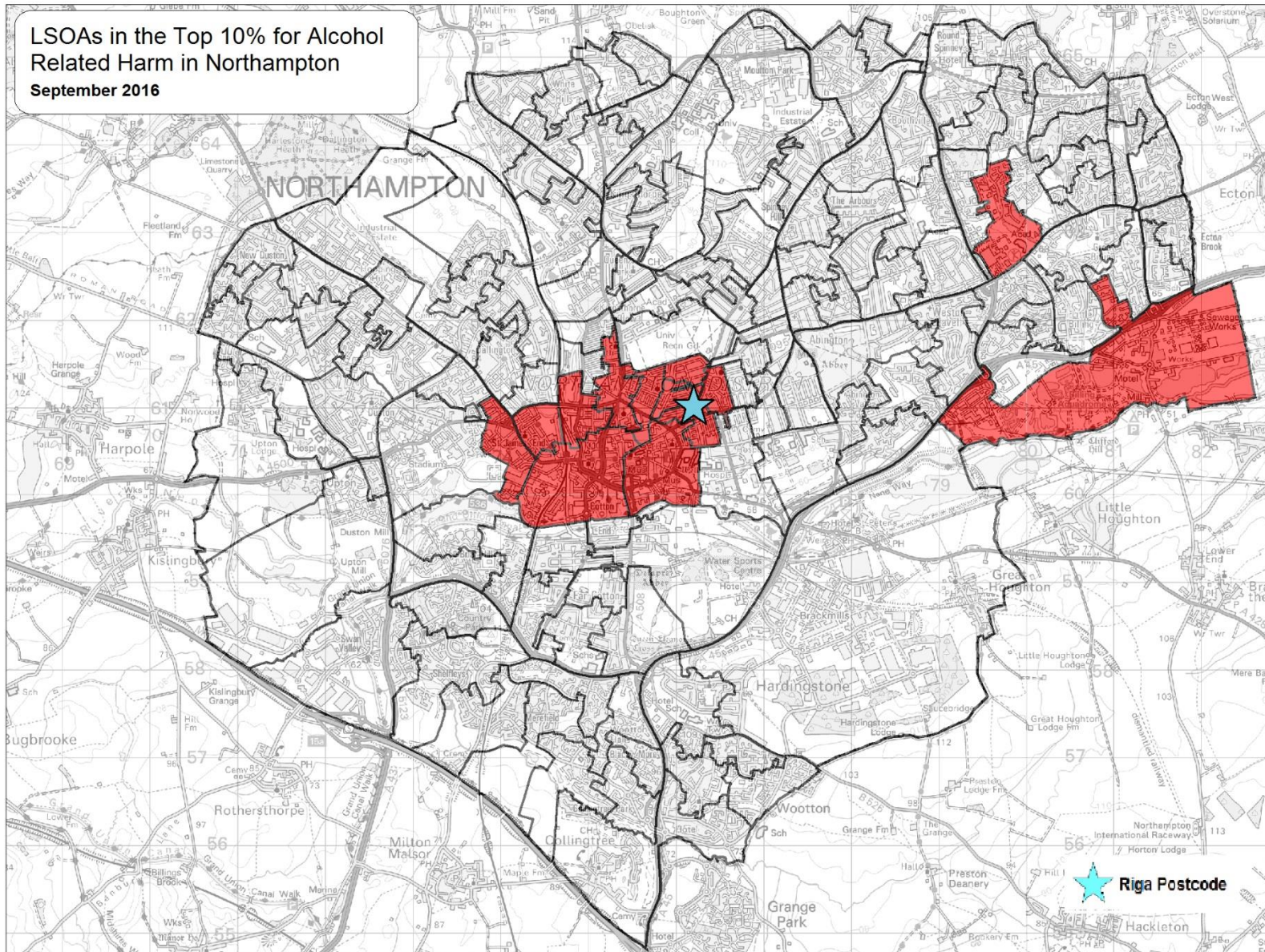

Morning Louise,

In respect to the above premises, I wish to raise a formal objection to this application on behalf of the Chief Constable of Northamptonshire Police.

My objection is on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety and are on the basis of the following:

- 1) The applicant is unsuitable due to crime and disorder issues.
- 2) The address given by the applicant would appear to be fraudulent as he has given his home address as a flat above the premises during recent contact with the police.
- 3) The address that he has given is a shop in Boston that has had numerous offences registered against it for illicit tobacco and illicit alcohol. The licence here has been revoked on numerous occasions and is currently unlicensed because of this.
- 4) Riga has a well-documented history of being involved in illicit tobacco.
- 5) The area of the Kettering Road where the premises is has a large amount of alcohol harm related issues including street drinking and anti-social behaviour. The cumulative impact of this premises having an alcohol licence would therefore undermine the licensing objectives.

I have cc'd the licensing consultant for this application so that they are aware of this.
